There is a rapid increase in the number of new reception students. Almost 80% of students were born in Australia. In recent years we have welcomed students from the UK, Egypt, India, Pakistan, America, South Africa, Thailand, China and New Zealand. Enrolments have increased from 197 in 2010 to 340 currently.

- **Year of opening**

St Leonards Primary School was officially opened in 1921. New developments occurred in 1986 when the Junior Primary Campus adjacent to the Old Gum Tree was sold and the whole school operated from a single site at Jervois Street. This school is part of the Holdfast Cluster of schools which includes the Glenelg, Paringa Park, Warradale and Brighton Primary Schools, together with local kindergartens and William Light R-12 School.

St Leonards Primary School is 10 kms from the GPO, and set in an area bounded by Anzac Highway and Tapleys Hill Road to the south and west.

Buses from the City along Anzac Highway or Tapleys Hill Road service the school and are within walking distance from the school.

2. Students (and their welfare)

- **General characteristics**

St Leonards Primary School is a community based, category 6 school, with approximately 20% school card students. Students are well behaved and develop good friendships due to the size of the school. The school's 240 families are generally well-educated with high expectations and are supportive of the school. St Leonards Primary School supports families by offering Before and After School Hours Care and a dynamic Vacation Care Program.

Student management is based upon the school values of Respect, Integrity, Co-operation, Encouragement and Responsibility. These values are embedded in student management processes and are explicitly taught. Student management processes use the processes and language of Restorative Practice, with a focus on how students can restore relationships and redress harm done. Student behaviour and harassment policies are available on the school website.

- **Student government**

Students vote each year to elect five (male and female) School Ambassadors. These ambassadors accept responsibilities to work throughout the school R-7, and provide leadership and role models for other students. Other leadership roles include Library Monitors, Science Guardians, Canteen Champions, Performing Arts Leaders, Sports Captains, Handy Helpers and ICT Tech Team. All classes also have SRC representatives.

Student-run Friday morning assemblies, held three times per term, provide an opportunity for students from every class to present their work and achievements before a large audience. Student Values Awards are presented to student by the School Ambassadors during Student Messages.

Teachers have been focussing on quality teaching and learning in the specific areas of Literacy, Numeracy and ICT. In 2015 all teachers are provided with iPads and Laptops. ICT is integrated across the curriculum daily.

There is a focus on student achievement through detailed ongoing assessment and record keeping, with a whole school assessment and reporting framework. This framework is available on the school website. Written student reports are prepared for the end of Terms 2 and 4. Student's data is collected by ScoreLink and analysed regularly.

Students are also encouraged to sit a number of external tests and challenges.

The school liaises with local pre-schools and feeder secondary schools. St Leonards Primary School works collaboratively with Brighton Primary School staff. Professional development sessions are shared throughout the year building strong networks.

A three year revolving program including gymnastics, dance and athletics have been a valuable addition to our Health and Physical Education program. There is also an active out of hours sporting presence especially in football (soccer), netball and volleyball with badminton and t-ball commencing shortly.

11. Local Community

- **General characteristics**

St Leonards Primary School is a community based, category 6 school, with approximately 20% school card students. The school's 240 families are generally well-educated and supportive of their children and of the school. The Governing Council and staff work together to ensure that St Leonards remains a friendly, welcoming community school where students are able to excel in a wide variety of areas. We have an increasing number of parents working on committees and in classrooms. Annual opinion surveys are very positive from parents, staff and students. The school offers a well balanced curriculum. Staff members are committed to innovative approaches that foster 21st Century learning. Students achieve highly in academic, sporting and musical endeavours.

Each year the school celebrates a range of events including Book Week, Science Week, PE Week, Celebration Night and Sports Day.

- **Parent and community involvement**

There is a strong community spirit that is reflected in the parent run sport that includes soccer, netball, volleyball and T-ball teams. St Leonards has two Canteen Managers and volunteer parents run the Uniform Shop. An active School Council and Fundraising Committee run a number of events each year. Each class has parent representatives who are responsible for organising class functions, welcoming new parents and providing classroom support when necessary. Parents select St Leonards Primary School due to the size and positive community presence.

St Leonards Primary School became zoned in 2014. Families living in Glenelg North and Novar Gardens fall within our zoned area. Children come from a number of local kindergartens and Child Care Centres, with the highest number coming from the nearby Baden Pattinson Kindergarten. Students exit Year 7 to attend variety of schools including William Light R-12, Brighton Secondary School, Henley High School, Urrbrae, Unley High School, Adelaide High School, Glenunga International High School, Mitcham Girls High School and independent schools.
