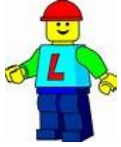

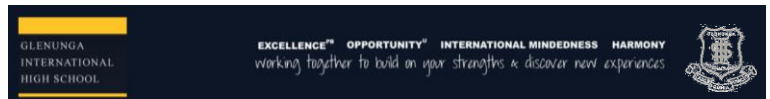
## Seeking Second-hand Donations
